"One for the Devil" by Etienne Leroux (W. H. Allen), 25s.

A CORPSE is found floating in a pool in a foundation dedicated to a model social order in South Africa.

Who among the many inhabitants in the foundation could have done it?" This is the pretty poser set in this fine detective story.

The detective, Demosthenes H. de Goede, is as unlikely a sleuth as the setting into which he is called. A man of few words and gestures, he seems far removed from the world of the more flamboyant detectives, such as Sherlock Holmes and Hercule Poirot.

But he is a very formidable one, as criminals discover to their cost and all his powers are brought into full play in this case.

This is no ordinary tale of suspense, but a penetrating commentary on human nature, and all its tangled complexities. A book both for the lover of a straight detective yarn and of a deep, searching documentary.
