"One for the Devil" by
Etienne Leroux (W. H. Allen),

A CORPSE is found floating in
a pool in a foundation dedi-
cated to a model social order in
South Africa.

Who among the many inhabi-
tants in the foundation could
have done it? This is the
pretty poser set in this fine
detective story.

The detective, Demosthenes H.
de Goede, is as unlikely a sleuth
as the setting into which he is
called. A man of few words
and gestures, he seems far re-
moved from the world of the
more flamboyant detectives, such
as Sherlock Holmes and Hercule
Poirot.

But he is a very formidable
one, as criminals discover to
their cost, and all his powers
are brought into full play in this
case.

This is no ordinary tale of
suspense, but a penetrating
commentary on human nature,
and all its tangled complexities.
A book both for the lover of a
straight detective yarn and of a
deep, searching documentary.
